Dear Parent/Carer,

My name is Pete Whitehouse and I am one of the Assistant Heads at The Emmbrook School. My main responsibilities include the assessment, recording and reporting of student progress.

Let me start by saying that I have thoroughly enjoyed the return to school. The past 18 months have seen unprecedented disruption to school life. Having students back full time in school has brought with it a welcome sense of normality.

Year 10 is an incredibly important academic year. The first year of Key Stage 4. The step up from Key Stage 3 to GCSE is a big one and the expectation is that students will hit the ground running. Students should now be confident they are on the right courses and be 100% committed to doing the best they can. They should be engaging with their learning both in and out of the classroom as well as taking advantage of any other opportunities that come their way.

There are some key aspects to school life which will be fundamental in ensuring that this year is as successful as it can be.

Attendance is crucial. Being in school, being in tutor time as well as lessons means that work will be up to date and key information received. Attendance demonstrates commitment and resilience and is crucial in underpinning academic success.

- 3) Develops the students exam and assessment skills ready for 'the real thing'
- 4) Allows subject areas to predict grades
