- Information which gives greater understanding of historical/social/moral/political context of work (why it was made it, when it was made it, what influenced it)
- Any interviews the Artist/Designer/Maker has given.
- Excerpts from essays, articles or books written about the Artist/Designer/Maker and their work.
- Screen shots and your own notes of films/documentaries/tv shows/podcasts about the Artist/Designer/Maker and their work.

Pure content is: complex numbers including polynomial equations and geometry, roots of polynomials, inequalities, summing series including method of differences, proof by induction, Maclaurin series, linear and quadratic rational functions, polar coordinates, conic sections, hyperbolic functions, mean values, volumes of revolution, properties and arithmetic of matrices, matrix transformations, systems of linear equations, vector equations of lines, the scalar product, finding distances using vectors.

Mechanics content is vectors, units and kinematics including graphs, SUVAT and variable acceleration, forces, motion under gravity and connected particles.

Key topics in each 'module' (you will always need to learn arguments for and against each area of contention AND precise evidence/examples to support these key arguments for Section A)

Section A

D and **P** – Pros and cons of representative democracy. Pros and cons of direct democracy. How far is there a participation crisis in the UK? How far is there a democratic deficit in the UK? How can democracy be improved in the UK (pros and cons of each method) Arguments for and against rights being well protected in the UK. **Pressure groups** – pros and cons of different methods groups use. Evaluation of how effective different methods used are – what makes a pressure group successful? How democratic are Pressure groups – are they elitist or pluralist? (arguments for and against) What are the pros and cons of think tanks and the pros and cons of lobbying firms being involved in politics?





Electoral systems – learns the pros and cons of each electoral system – FTPT, SV, STV and AMS. Pros and cons of referendums in a representative democracy. Impact of different electoral system on party systems, types of government, voter choice

Political parties –How united/divided are the 3 main parties (Con, Lab, Lib Dem). How far Tories One Nation or Thatcherite. How far are Labour moderate- Third Way or Old Labour. How far do political parties follow liberal values. Pros and cons of state funded parties. How far do the two major parties dominate the UK's political system

Voting Behaviour and the Media – how far do different forms of media influence how people vote – print newspaper, online news, radio, TV, social. How far do different key factors influence how people vote (use your big A3 summary sheet for this) Think about factors such as age, gender, ethnicity, region, class (social factors) influence voting. Also consider valence issues, party manifestoes, campaigns. **MAKE SURE YOU HAVE KEY EVIDENCE FROM 3 DIFFERENT ELECTIONS – ONE PRE 1997, 1997 AND ONE AFTER 1997.**

<u>Section B – Core ideologies</u>

Learn and be able to describe the views of the Key thinkers in each core ideology - YOU MUST USE WELL-DEVELOPED EXPLANATIONS OF TWO KEY THINKERS' VIEWS IN YOUR REPSONSES TO GET ABOVE A LEVEL 2!

Learn similarities and differences in views within each ideology around the key thematic areas – Human Nature, Society, the State and the Economy and work out how similar/different views are on these thematic areas. Think about how coherent each ideology is.
