Work is only sometimes completed and demonstrates a need to continue to develop an independent learning attitude 	<p>Home learning attitude requires improvement:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Task are sometimes late and the student fails to provide an acceptable explanation • Quality sometimes fails to meet expectations • Completes some/most tasks • Some homework tasks missed due to absence have been caught up • Sometimes fails to meet deadlines
D Inadequate	<p>Attitude during lessons is poor:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Punctuality is causing a concern and impacting learning • Work is often below expectations • Fails to complete tasks • Does not contribute to lessons • Missed class work due to absence has not been caught up • ISP's are not utilised. Work is not completed and demonstrates an urgent need to prioritise developing an independent learning attitude 	<p>Home learning attitude is poor:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Tasks are often late and the student fails to provide an acceptable explanation • Quality is below expectations • Fails to complete tasks • Homework tasks missed due to absence have not been caught up • Often misses deadlines

D Inadequate	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Rarely/never engages in form time activities, this includes taking actions relating to their post 18 plans • Is rarely on time when required to be in school • Rarely/never contributes to the wider school community 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Rarely has the required equipment • Evidence of concerns around learning from classroom teachers • Is frequently late for lessons
