



Sixth Form Dress Code

The sixth form dress code is designed to reflect the high expectations of the school and is based upon dress codes that are becoming more common in workplaces.

All sixth form students:

- Are role models for the lower school and have a responsibility to model suitable standards of dress and appearance.
- Are representatives of The Emmbrook School, post-16 students must dress appropriately for school in a casual but smart manner.
- Their dress and appearance must therefore be appropriate to support and encourage the ethos of the school and the uniform and appearance policies in operation in Years 7 to 11.
- Sixth Form ID badges must be worn at all times. This is a safeguarding measure and therefore non-negotiable.

Sixth Form students should remember the follow:

- Jeans and trousers are to be smart.
- Necklines should not reveal cleavage.
- No strapless tops.
- No cropped-tops.
- Skirts/dresses must be of a suitable length.
- Smart shorts are permitted in summer.
- Leggings can be worn if under a dress or skirt but not in place of trousers.
- Hooded clothing may only be worn with the hood down.
- Hats should not be worn indoors.
- Inappropriate slogans must not be worn on clothing.
- Smart shoes or smart trainers.
- No flip flops or sliders.
- Tracksuits are not permitted.

The Head of Sixth and/or SLT has the final say on whether clothing and appearance is appropriate

If a sixth form student's clothing or appearance is not deemed appropriate, the tutor will address in the first instances. If the situation is not rectified at this point, the Head of Sixth, SLT and ultimately the Headteacher will speak to the student concerned and ensure the situation is rectified.
